
Design Studies PhD Proficiency Exam Procedure



(After being successful from FFD 697, should be in 6 months' time after the proficiency exam)



1.PEP (Annotated Bibliography):

- •It is a commentary paper which is the brief account of the available research on the targeted subject. It is a list of citations to books, articles, and documents, and includes concise descriptions and evaluations of each source in relation with each other.
- •It should be an extended and critical commentary on the selected bibliography. Student is expected to provide a brief summaryof content and a short analysis and/or evaluation by reflecting, summarising, criticising, evaluating and analysing the the selected bibliography.
- •The selected bibliography should provide an acceptable and strong foundation for the field of study by discussing the theory, historyand recent studies in the targeted subject in Design Studies.
- •The format of PEP should be well structured as introduction, main body, conclusion and bibliography. In the conclusion, studentis expected to present the draft research question(s)(RQs) so that in the oral exam there will be a discussion on the topic and the RQs to provide constructive criticism for the next step FFD 698 Dissertation Proposal.

- •Word limit is 6000-8000 including bibliography/references. The format of the text is like the thesis format that is provided by the graduate school (https://lisansustu.ieu.edu.tr/en/tez-yazim-kilavuzu)

2. Targeted Research Subject:

•PEP should not be a dissertation proposal but rather an overview of the theory on a subject or specific field of study in Design Studies. It can be any subject in relation with history, theory and practice of design and design related topics.

3. PE Written Exam:

- •According to the targeted research subject that is presented in the PEP, each jury member is asked to prepare one question. This question can either ask to elaborate any issue related with the subject that is not discussed enough in the paper or a general theory and/or history question in relation with the related field of study in design studies.
- •The question that is prepared by the prospective dissertation supervisor should be a research methods question that evaluates the research skills of the student (i.e. structuring a methodology).
- •In the written exam, student is asked to respond the Research Methods question (by the prospective dissertation Supervisor) and any selected two questions (total 3 questions should be answered). The written exam is evaluated by the jury members.

4. PE Oral Exam:

- •If the student is successful from the written exam (80 points or more) within three days time s/he is invited for an oral examination.
- •In this examination, student is asked to deliver a very short presentation in which s/ he is expected to present draft research questions in relation with the targeted research subject.
- •This presentation should not be more than 15 minutes and briefly summarise the paper and present the aimed research study.

•However, it should not be the Dissertation Proposal.

- •The evaluation criteria are:
- A.The level of student's knowledge on the targeted research subject
- B. How competent the student is in design research methods (research question, hypothesis proposal, testing the hypothesis, structuring a research study etc)
- C.Academic writing skills
- D.Oral presentation abilities.
