HOW TO ENROL IN A COURSE

I. LOGIN TO OASIS

Log in to the system with your OASIS password, PIN code and verification code (CAPTCHA).

If you have never logged in to OASIS before, you can learn how to receive your OASIS password and how to make your security settings at <u>https://www.ieu.edu.tr/tlc/en/about-smart-campus</u> address.

II. COURSE ENROLLMENTS

After logging into OASIS, you may enroll in a course by clicking on **Course Enrollments /Undergraduate and Associate Course Enrollments** buttons respectively.

The university may make changes in the courses and the programs students have chosen.

The users may view the pages either in Turkish or in English.




Figure 1: Entering Course Enrollments Screen

II.I. Course Enrollment Screen and Explanations

II.I.1. Academic Status

In this section, you can see your CGPA, your class, total number of ECTS credits you took, your total course load for the relevant semester.

Students, who are required to do interactive registration, enter their OASIS passwords with their advisor by using computers on campus local network during add-drop period.

240 ECTS credits are required in order to graduate from Undergraduate (4 years) Programs;

120 ECTS credits (European Credit Transfer System) **are required** in order to graduate **from Associate (2 years) Programs.**

Please pay attention to the ECTS credits of the courses when you are enrolling in order to meet the total credit requirement.





a) Students, given that they do not exceed their regular course load (32 ECTS credits per semester), have to take the following courses in the below order in order to obtain specified cumulative grade point averages:

- failed courses (FF, FD, W, U) and non-attendance (NA) courses,
- courses from lower grades they have not taken before,
- courses from current grade they have not taken yet.

b) Students may take courses, they have taken before and want to raise grades for, with the approval of their advisor.

c) Students may take course(s) of maximum 12 ECTS credits from upper grade provided that they get their advisor's approval. However, students, who fail to obtain the grade point average for more than four semesters in the same grade (cumulative GPA of 1.50 at the end of first grade, 1.70 at the end of second grade, 1.80 at the end of third grade), lose their right to take a course from upper grade. The semesters, in which the student fails to renew registration, are included in the four semesters' calculation.

II.I.2. Search for your Courses

The courses you failed, and all the courses you can take in the relevant semester from lower/current grades are included.

Students, who have received an FF, FD, NA, W or U in any course, or have not taken a course during the regular semester, have to repeat it in the first semester the course is offered.

The kind of courses stated here are specified in above colors.

Green: Indicates the courses you need to take in the respective semester based on the department/program instruction plan for your grade.

Red: Indicates the courses that you were unsuccessful before and you have to take. You may change the section of the course by examining the alternative day, hour and classes of the course Turquoise: Indicates the Compulsory Courses from Lower and Upper classes.

Purple: Indicates Elective Course.

Blue: Indicates the General Education Course pools.

Orange: Indicates Double Major Program (DMP)/ Minor Program (MP) courses.

Yellow: Indicates the courses taken to Grade Up Lessons.

You can see the number of sections from the "Number of Section" column across the course. You can see the weekly course schedule and the quotas for that course in "Search Results" by clicking to "Search" button. You can enroll to a course you wish by clicking the "+" button in the "Add" column.

II.I.3. Searching for Compulsory Courses from Upper Grades

When you want to take a compulsory course from the upper grade, you can select the course from the "Upper Required Courses" field, search by typing the code of the course or the name of the course.

II.I.4. Double Major/Minor Courses

The Double Major Program (DMP)/ Minor Program (MP) courses that DMP/MP students must take are included in the "Courses You Can Take" field. The elective courses to be taken for DMP/MP can be taken by selecting the course from the "Elective Courses & Double Major/Minor Courses" field, searching for it by typing the code of the course or the name of the course, and ticking the DMP/MP box on the right.

Students can take 48 ECTS credit courses the most in a semester in addition to double major, minor program courses.

Students enrolled in **Double Major Program (DMP)** and **Minor Program (MP)** can enroll by ticking the **DMP/MP box** on the right side of the course after searching for the elective courses to be taken in this program from the Elective Course Search field.

II.I.7. Courses for Repeat

II.I.11.Save

After completing all the steps above about your course enrolment, **click "Save" button** and complete your course enrolment procedures.

You need to click on "Save" button again after any changes.

You need advisor approval during the initial registration also. Please follow up the approval procedures of your advisors.

II.I.12. Those Who Paid Tuition Fee But Did Not Make Course Registration

Those, who paid their tuition fees but did not complete their course enrolment through the internet by **Thursday, February 15, 2024 at 13.00**, will be able to complete their course enrolments on their own through OASIS between **27-28 and 29 February 2024 (Until 11.00)** during Add-Drop period.

II.I.13. Course Add-Drop Procedure

Courses in Spring semester begin on **19 February**, **2024**.

Add-Drop will not take place in the first week.

In the first week, students will follow the courses they registered to; the system will be accessible for add-drop in the second week 27-28 and 29 February 2024).

III.2. Interactive Registration

Students who require Interactive Registration are required to make their course registration approval by meeting with their advisor.

III.3. Invitation for Interactive Approval

Students, who are not subject to Interactive Registration, may be invited by their advisors for Interactive Approval when necessary.

Students, who are invited for Interactive approval by their advisors, are instantly sent OASIS and GSM messages.

Students in this situation must meet with their advisor to get course registration approvals.

III.4. Full Approval

Full approval is granted by the advisor when all courses, selected by student, are in accordance with the regulation.

III.5. Tentative Approval

Tentative approval may be granted for courses, which are selected in accordance with the regulation, that are not recommended by the advisor to be taken for that semester. The justification for tentative approval is recorded in the system.

Tentative approvals for students, whose course registrations are approved, are also stated on their screen.
