

## WITHDRAWAL CONDITIONS

- Students cannot withdraw from the courses they have to repeat (**for the master's degree** the previous grades are FF, FD, DD, NA, U and failed), and (**for the doctorate** the previous grades FF, FD, DD, DC, NA, U and failed).
- Students cannot withdraw from the courses taken to upgrade their grades.
- Students cannot withdraw from the courses for which they received a W-Withdrawal grade.

- Students can withdraw from 1 course at most in a semester.
- Graduate students can withdraw from 2 courses at most during their education.
- Students cannot withdraw from courses that are not included in the GPA. (Courses evaluated with S; U and P grades such as projects, seminars, thesis etc.)
- Course withdrawals are made on the dates specified in the academic calendar.
- The withdrawal of exchange students studying at our university can be done with the recommendation of the International Relations Office and the permission of the lecturer.
